### **PC D110 William MULVIHILL**

**Private 11916**  
**1<sup>st</sup> battalion Irish Guards**  
**Died of wounds in France**  
**3<sup>rd</sup> December 1917**

William was born 3<sup>rd</sup> September 1895 in Creete, County Galway. His father was Patrick 1847-1930, a shepherd and his mother was Mary Mulvihill nee Hegarty 1853-1935

He was the youngest of 8 surviving children out of 13 children of Patrick and Mary

On 28<sup>th</sup> March 1914, William joined Birmingham City Police as an 18-year - old miner. He served on the 'D' division, with warrant number 8465 and collar number D110. He worked from Victoria Road Police Station

William resigned on 5<sup>th</sup> March 1917 to join the army which he did in Birmingham

William was wounded in action and succumbed to his injuries at 21 Casualty Clearing Station in Ytres, France

William is buried at Rocquigny-Equancourt Road British Cemetery, Manancourt, France. Grave VI E 6
